Family Medicine Curriculum

The curriculum at the Riverside Family Medicine Residency is designed to expose residents to all areas of medicine needed to provide comprehensive and continuous care to their patients.

Though generally set up as monthly rotations, the curriculum includes many elements that are longitudinal, such as Behavioral Science, Practice Management, Drug Usage, and Geriatrics.

There is elective time in the second and third years to allow a resident to explore areas of personal interest or perfect skills that they will need in their future practice. Additionally, a scholarly project is required in the third year that involves a year-long investigation of a topic of interest to the resident. Each scholarly project culminates in a presentation to the residency program and often includes a clinical review
