SCOPE

This policy is in effect for the Family Medicine residency program at Dublin Methodist Hospital.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

It is through the program's eligibility policy that a program will demonstrate that it requires an adequate level of preparation from all applicants prior to entry into an ACGME designated osteopathic track resident position. This policy establishes the minimum prerequisite requirements in order to increase the chance of resident success and compliance with the requirements of the Osteopathic Recognition track.

DEFINITION

The term "resident" refers to a trainee accepted into the Dublin Methodist Family Medicine Residency Program.

POLICY

The following prerequisites are required for residents to complete prior to entering a Dublin Methodist Family Medicine ACGME designated osteopathic track position.

1. Graduate of a Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) - accredited college of osteopathic medicine (COM) who holds a DO degree:
 - a. No additional requirements are necessary prior to participation in the Osteopathic Track.
2. Graduate of a medical school in the United States or Canada, accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME):
 - a. Indication during new intern Onboarding of interest in entering the Osteopathic Track.
 - i. Intent to participate in the track must be received by the end of week 2 of block 1.
 - b. Structured basic Osteopathic Principles and Practice training prior to beginning residency that must include the following:
 - i. Osteopathic philosophy, history, terminology, and code of ethics;
 - ii. Anatomy and physiology related to osteopathic medicine;
 - iii. Indications, contraindication, and safety issues associated with the use of OMT; and,
 - iv. Palpatory diagnosis, osteopathic structural examination, and OMT.

This requirement may be met by completing **one** of the following prior to entry into the Training Program:

- ☐ Formal didactics provided by an accredited organization (AOA AAO, AACOM, ACOEP, ACOPMR and ACOI), osteopathic medical school, or a training site with AOA and or ACGME Osteopathic Principles and Practices, including the application of OMT.
- ☐ Time spent in a clinical setting where OPP/OMT is utilized as a significant contribution in the management of patients under the supervision of an osteopathically trained physician.

- ☐ Prior completion of elective Osteopathic Principles and Practice rotations.
- ☐ Registration for the Ohio University Heritage College of Medicine Osteopathic Medicine for All Course.
 - Prior to completion of the course, residents will be considered “track eligible” but will not be entered into a designated spot in ACGME ADS.
 - After successful completion of the course, residents must meet with the Osteopathic Track Director to confirm preparedness and will then be entered into a designated spot in ADS.

3. Graduate from a medical school outside of the United States or Canada:

- a. In addition to all of the above, must meet the criteria listed in policy ME-1000.062 Recruitment, Selection, Eligibility and Appointment of Trainees.

By signing this policy, I attest that I have met the requirements of entry into the Dublin Methodist Family Medicine Residency Program Osteopathic Track, and intend to complete this training.
