GRANT FAMILY MEDICINE: CURRICULUM

At the heart of our curriculum is an emphasis on continuity of care, community engagement, and scope of practice. Most experiences are scheduled in 2 week rotations to allow for longitudinal learning. Residents are supported in their growth and given graduated autonomy at every step.

Our longitudinal curriculum components include ambulatory care, population health, behavioral health, quality/safety, research, addiction medicine, community medicine, and procedural skills.

Residents can further specialize their curricular experience through Areas of Concentration, which include advocacy, faculty development, geriatrics, global health, HIV, hospitalist, LGBTQ+, reproductive health, sports medicine, and urban underserved.
